This year's event includes formal recognition of the Birgit and Robert Bateman Bursary. Presented to one or more students enrolled in Royal Roads' School of Environment and Sustainability's MA Environmental Education and Communication program, the award reflects the Bateman's shared life-long commitment to education and the environment.
